We would like to acknowledge the Traditional Owners of the land where we meet today, and pay our respects to elders past, present and future.


We honour their continuing culture, knowledge, beliefs and spiritual relationship and connection to Country.

Through collaboration and two-way knowledge sharing, we can learn from each other.








Partnering for Impact with First Nations Australians
