# Meeting Minutes of the 34th International Research Ship Operators meeting held at the Grand Hotel Casselbergh, Bruges, Belgium, 16-20<sup>th</sup> October, 2023

## Host organization – The meeting was co-hosted by Flanders Marine Institute (VLIZ) and the Royal Belgian Institute of Natural Sciences (RBINS)

**Introduction** – A total of 126 participants from 23 countries attended this 34th IRSO meeting that confirms efficient sharing of information and resolution of problems of common interest for the research ship operators. This allows the marine scientific community's research efforts at sea to be ever better supported.

### Monday 16th October-2023 - Workshop

A two-hour open discussion on "ICES working group on Greening the RV fleet...a workshop for vessel operators" was hosted by Aodhan Fitzgerald.

## **RV Operators session –**

An open forum discussion. Topics;

1. Terms of Reference – Rose Dufour asked for clarification about the environmental impact.

**Action item**: establishing a volunteer's group to draft a new version of the ToR to be presented during the next IRSO meeting.

2. **Membership** – For the industry representatives to attend we want to ensure that their participation is of benefit and value to the wider IRSO community. We would want to rearrange the participation of the industry representatives. Rose suggested limiting the industry participation to one day only, as was the case during the meeting in Anacapri.

Lieven suggested accepting a maximum number of presentations.

Toni proposed to review the ToR providing criteria for the participation of the industry component through guidelines.

**3. Website** – Greg presented examples of a potential new IRSO logo. We agreed on the need to revamp the IRSO website, recognizing that this has a cost and the need for resources.

Rose confirmed UNOLS' willingness to support the maintenance of the IRSO website. We would want to open a discussion forum. Giuseppe proposed the establishment of an IRSO Ex-Com, including the secretariat, to support the administrative activities.

**Action item**: launch a survey to choose a new IRSO logo and re-activating the discussion forum already existing.

- **4. Working Groups** We would want to promote regular virtual working group meetings to improve the discussion and enlarge the geographical spread. Rose proposed the establishment of a Working Group on cybersecurity. We confirmed the Working Groups on the following topics:
  - a. MFP
  - b. Heath & Wellbeing

Greg provided an overview of INMARTECH 2023, hosted by CSIS in Barcelona 20-22 June. The event was supported by 8 sponsors (Kongsberg, Macgregor, Scanmar, Hawboldt Industries, Sonardyne, Oceansonics, EIVA, BoxFish Research.

The successful event was attended by 114 people from 60 institutions and companies.

40 technical talks were held over the two days, 19 posters were presented and there were 4 workshops and 8 technical sessions demo and show rooms of the industry representatives.

**Guided city tour and canal boat trip** – The participants were divided into groups of 12 people to join a guided tour of the historical city of Bruges that included a canal boat trip. The guided tour started from Burg Square to Grote Markt, discovering the Madonna of Bruges, the marble sculpture by Michelangelo of the Virgin and Child, the Lake of Love, and walking along the Chocolate Boulevard.





**Conference Dinner at Brewery Halve Maan** — Dinner was preceded by a guided tour of the brewery. The dishes were accompanied by a beer tasting: 4 beers from 4.5% up to 11% alcohol. Participants had also the opportunity to experience the art of tapping a beer and the competition was playfully organized. A wonderful evening, great food, excellent entertainment. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed it.










## Tuesday 20th October-2023 - Day 4
