
Research Vessels Needed for the Science Wanted

- Organizes national interdisciplinary discussions to plan the future of offshore research vessel capacity in Atlantic Canada.




The NRVTT is comprised of over 40 stakeholders.



For Canadian scientists across all disciplines, research vessels are crucial for monitoring, observing, and understanding the vast ocean ecosystem.


Our ocean environment needs scientific information more than ever, yet this capability has declined over the decades.

Are affected by lacking ship-time access.




61% Of chief scientists have **not**

Modular Ocean Research Infrastructure (MORI)

- Complements the building or purchasing of specialized ocean research vessels.
- Integrates existing containerized systems (e.g. container labs) with specialized research infrastructure.
- Eliminates costly and time-consuming vessel repositioning.
- A sophisticated ocean research vessel that is flexible, economical, scalable, and quicker to-build and deliver.


